
# What advice would you give students pursuing a career in Educational Leadership?



# Important FAFSA Updates

The new and improved FAFSA will be available by December 31st, 2023. The new FAFSA form will significantly improve, streamline, and redesign how students and their families use the form. For the first time, applicants will be able to securely transfer their federal tax information necessary for the eligibility calculation, directly from the IRS.

As the Department of Education works to finalize the FAFSA Simplification Act, Charlotte is committed to communicating changes to the awarding process and anticipated impacts to our students and families as soon as details are confirmed.

As previously shared, The <u>U.S. Department of Education</u> released that the improved FAFSA form will be

As you and your family prepare to complete the <u>FAFSA for the 2024-2025 aid year</u>, here are a few things to consider.

- Create an FSA ID: We encourage you and your family to take the first step in getting ready to file your FAFSA by <u>creating your FSA IDs</u>. Everyone, regardless of whether they have a Social Security Number, will be required to have an FSA ID in order to access and submit the FAFSA.
- Apply Early: To maximize your financial aid eligibility, it is important to submit your application as early as possible.
- 3. Help is Available: If you have any questions or need assistance with completing your FAFSA, Niner Central Specialists are available to help. As a reminder, the University is closed Dec. 22, 2023 - Jan. 1, 2024. Don't hesitate to connect with us for guidance and support with your application in the new year.

Completing your FAFSA is a critical step in ensuring that you have access to financial resources you need to pursue your education. Remember, we are here to support you in your academic journey, including securing financial aid.

December 1st is the anniversary of Rosa Parks' decision to sit down for her rights on a Montgomery, Alabama, bus

On the evening of December 1, 1955, Rosa Parks was arrested for disobeying an Alabama law requiring Black passengers to relinquish seats to white passengers when the bus was full. Black patrons also were required to sit at the back of the bus. Her arrest sparked a 381-day boycott of the Montgomery bus system and led to a 1956 Supreme Court decision banning segregation on public transportation.
