PROGRAM OVERVIEW

30-Credit Hours

Today, educational leaders must be able to elicit support and create environments that foster the kinds of creativity, change, and innovation that will educate diverse populations. To meet this challenge, the M.Ed. in Educational Leadership (Higher Education) focuses on multifaceted leadership development. The program provides for 30 credit hours of coursework, which includes a focus on unique professional pursuits of individual students, under the advisement of program faculty. Individual student curriculum plans include coursework in professional education and administration and leadership as well as electives in specific areas of research, administration, and educational instructional systems technology. The program design creates options for greater course-taking flexibility. This flexibility allows students the ability to meet their professional and academic goals.



CURRICULUM

Coursework is organized into core, concentration-specific to educational leadership, and elective courses. Each student works with an advisor to design a master's experience tailored to meet their professional interests.



DELIVERY

- Main campus.
- Courses are a combination of face-to-face and hybrid delivery methods.
- Classes during fall and spring begin at 5:30 PM.
- 30-credit-hour program can be completed in two years.



CAPSTONE

All master's students complete an electronic portfolio housing appropriate artifacts and evidences under the direction of program faculty. The portfolio demonstrates the candidate's academic growth in educational leadership that is reflective of a practitioner-scholar.

CURRICULUM

Graduates must complete a minimum of 30 semester-hours including 9 hours of professional education core courses, 15 hours of coursework in educational leadership, and 6 hours of electives. Students plan with advisors to select courses relevant to their professional interests. The successful preparation of an electronic portfolio under the direction of program faculty is also required.
