The concentration in P-12 Superintendency is designed to serve the needs of those interested in the study of issues regarding the administration of P-12 public and private educational institutions. The doctoral degree allows students to consider careers as directors, school or district level administrators, superintendents and senior-level administrators. The program offers high quality course instruction from respected and experienced faculty who are scholarpractitioners. We emphasize advancing training in leadership through courses that integrate theoretical and practical knowledge. The program is structured to meet the demands of full-time working professionals.



## CURRICULUM

Coursework is organized into core leadership, concentration-specific, and research courses. Each student works with an advisor to design a doctoral experience tailored to meet their professional and scholarly interests.

### **CAPSTONE**

All doctoral students complete an applied dissertation that addresses a problem of practice that is relevant to the area of major. The problem of practice uses research inquiry and evaluation to study current conditions to make effective decisions.

- Admission is only for the fall semester.
- Rolling admission is based on available
- Graduate Certificate, Master's or Doctoral application fee
  - \$75 U.S. citizens and permanent residents
  - \$85 International applicants

## **CURRICULUM**

Students are required to complete a minimum of 48credit-hours of doctoral (8000-level) coursework beyond the master's degree, complete the qualifying examination (portfolio), and applied doctoral dissertation

### **ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS**

- Graduate School online application
- Transcripts from each postsecondary institution attended
- Official TOEFL scores if the applicant's native language is not English
- Preference is given to those with at least three years of relevant work experience in PK-12 leadership
- Three references
- Statement of purpose
- Résumé or CV
- Writing sample **OR** a response to a writing prompt
- "M" level licensure
- Qualified applicants may be required to interview as part of the admissions process

### \*GRE or MAT test scores are not required

Meeting the minimum admission requirements does not guarantee admission into the program. Competitive applicants often exceed minimum requirements. Admissions decisions are competitive and are made by a departmental admissions committee.
